SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

November 2014

The Governors of Wenlock C of E Junior School have determined that pupils are required to wear an “in school” uniform with royal blue and grey as the predominant colours.

The Wenlock sweatshirt bears the school crest and name. This is available from the school office. A blue tee shirt is also available from the office.

Girls: Wenlock sweatshirt/fleece (purchased from Wenlock)
White polo shirt/blouse
White socks (trainer socks are not acceptable)
Sensible black shoes (black trainers are not acceptable)
Grey skirt/grey trousers for winter
Blue and white gingham dress for summer
(white leg ins for cultural observance only)

Boys: Wenlock sweatshirt/fleece (purchased from Wenlock)
White polo shirt/shirt
Black/Grey Socks (trainer socks are not acceptable)
Sensible black shoes (black trainers are not acceptable)
Grey Trousers

P.E. & Games Kit: Black plimsolls (for indoor P.E.)
Trainers (for outdoor games)
Blue shorts (purchased from Wenlock) (or
royal blue or black leg ins/jogging bottoms may be
worn for cultural observance only)
Tee shirt blue (purchased from Wenlock)

Dark tracksuit top and bottoms for winter months

Swimming: One piece costume or trunks (not shorts)

Lunchtimes: Trainers may be worn at the lunch time break only.

Headware for cultural observance only

- It is solid black and **does not** require a pin or brooch to secure it
- It fits close to the head and does not flap around
- It must be removed for PE/Games for Health and Safety reasons

Appearance

- No jewellery is allowed other than a watch and a single set of small plain studs which **must** be removed for PE lessons. Children that wear any other jewellery will be asked to remove them.
- Haircuts should be suitable for school – we actively discourage fashion fads including shaved hair designs and dyed hair.
- Shoulder length hair or longer must be tied up at all times with a plain hairband.
- Alice bands may be worn but need to be plain
- Make up and nail varnish are not appropriate for school.
- Sunglasses are not allowed to be worn by pupils in school.

Non Uniform Days

These are held occasionally for fun or fund raising projects. Non uniform days mean children attending school in appropriate casual clothing. Appearance as detailed above, still apply.
